Clinical/medical genetics officially recognised as an EU- 16.Mar.2011

On March 3rd, 2011 the Commission adopted Regulation (EU) No 213/2011 amending Annexes II and V to Directive 2005/36/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council on the recognition of professional qualifications. This administrative act implies that the clinical / medical genetics specialty w a sofficially recognised as an EU- wide specialty and this regulation came into force the following day! This regulation is also relevant for the **EEA** countries and will be important in the near future for many EU-Accession countries, thereby potentially reaching a European-wide relevance.
