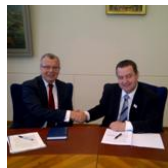
Forced migration: a humanitarian tragedy exploited by smugglers



Over 70 million people are forced migrants - more than one in every 100 of the world's citizens displaced by conflict, political upheaval, violence and disasters but also by climate change and development projects, according to the World Disasters Report 2012 of the International Federation of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC). Of these, some 50 million irregular migrants are believed to have used the services of smugglers at some stage of their journey, says the UN Development

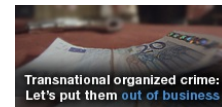
